

How Do I Keep My Healing?

Each one of us must understand how to receive healing and keep it. When we understand God's Word on healing and act upon it, it brings forth a manifestation of healing in our physical bodies (Matthew 9:20–22). Our goal is to receive the manifestation of healing and give our heavenly Father the glory for what Jesus has done for us.

The enemy wants to steal the word before it can become firmly rooted in us to produce the healing. The devil knows that the Word of God is more powerful than his work—sickness—so he must try to pluck out God's Word in us before it gets firmly rooted in our hearts. Only seed that is firmly rooted can produce a harvest (Matthew 13:3–9).

When we receive the word on healing and are prayed for, and healing takes place, we receive it with joy. It must become firmly rooted in us because the devil will always try to inflict us with the very same symptoms, to get us to change our minds. If he can get you to doubt what God has done, Satan can get a new foothold in your life. Satan is a liar (John 8:44) and a thief (John 10:10) and his goal is to wear you down and get you to give up on all that God has for you. If the devil can cause us to look at the symptoms instead of God's promises, he can convince us to believe his lies and get you to give up on all that God has promised for you. We must keep our hearts and our minds fixed on God and His promises (Psalm 108:1, KJV). We cannot let fear and sickness be reestablished in our lives.

We must hold fast that which is good (I Thessalonians 5:21). We must allow the Word of God to take root so that it can complete the manifestation of healing in our bodies. When the symptoms try to return, we must set our faith in God's word and tell the enemy that, no matter what, we are *not* going to believe his lies. Are you ready to fight for your healing? Are you ready to see what else the Father has for you?

If so, here are some things you can do; they are fun and very easy. 1) Give God the glory for what He has done already. 2) Sing and listen to praise and worship in your home (dancing is good, too). 3) Stay in the Word and read it out loud. 4) Rebuke the symptoms and bind them away from you; Jesus has already paid for them—*they are not yours*.

Speak and pray this page out loud so that these concepts are rooted deep in your heart:

Heavenly Father, I thank You for Your living word. You said that Your Word is life to those who find it and health to all their flesh (Proverbs 4:20–23). Today, by my confession, I apply Your Word to my body.

You said in Psalm 139:14 that I am fearfully and wonderfully made and that Your works are marvelous. I declare that I was created by You and I am a marvelous creation.

I speak to sickness and disease today and proclaim, according to Philippians 2:9–10, that they must bow down to the mighty Name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Every name in heaven, on earth, and under the earth—including the name of every disease and unhealthy condition attempting to come on me—must bow its knee to Jesus' name.

I speak to my body today and declare that I have authority over it (I Corinthians 9:24–27). I command it to receive the Word of God. Matthew 8:16–17 proclaims that Jesus healed *all* who were sick, in order to fulfill Isaiah 53:4–5, which states that Jesus bore my sicknesses and took my infirmities.

Heavenly Father, I thank you that the same spirit that raised Jesus from the dead dwells in me and makes alive my *mortal body* (Romans 8:11).

I speak to my immune system and command it to line up with the Word of God. My immune system will destroy sickness and disease in my body and perform its job, for this is what God created it to do.

I thank you, Father, that every cell in my body responds to Your Word. Your Word permeates my body from the top of my head to the bottom of my feet. I confess that the Word of God is being made flesh in me.

Psalm 103:2–4 declares that You, Father, forgive *all* my iniquities and heal *all* my diseases. Father, that is Your confession and I make it my confession also. I don't judge by the sight of my eyes; instead, I judge rightly, by Your living Word (John 7:24). It is Your Word that lives in me and brings health and healing to every part of my body (John 4:50–53).

Heavenly father, I rejoice at your promise of divine health (Proverbs 3:7–8). You said it and I believe it! Today, I declare that I will see your promise of healing manifest in my body (Isaiah 58:6–8, III John 2).

Healing is mine because Jesus paid the price 2000 years ago. God so loved me that he sent his son to die in the cross so that I could experience life on God's terms (John 3:16). His abundant life is manifesting in me (John 10:10), making me whole: spirit, soul, *and* body (I Thessalonians 5:23). Amen.
